



Attendance vs Outcomes

Pupils with **no absence** are 1.5 times more likely to achieve 5+ GCSEs grade 4-9 (including English and Maths)

Pupils with 95% attendance in every school year are **5 times more likely** to achieve grades 5-9 in English and Maths than pupils with below 80% attendance



HOME LEARNING

The act of completing learning at home independently either retrieving something that has already been studied or learning advanced topics.

The focus of home learning will take three phases:

- 1. Retrieval getting pupils to think about the topics they have learned previously
- 2. Flipped learning research a topic they have not yet studied
- 3. Revision recap topics learned for formative assessments



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
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
