Year 9 Students Experience Hair & Beauty at Exeter College



A group of enthusiastic Year 9 students recently had the fantastic opportunity to visit Exeter College for a Hair and Beauty Taster Morning, and what a day it was!



The morning kicked off with a Barbering Taster Session, where students were introduced to block heads (mannequin heads with realistic hair) and taught how to handle hair clippers. With a quick demonstration and plenty of excitement, the students jumped straight in, each creating their own unique hairstyle. It was brilliant to see everyone getting involved and showing real creativity with their designs.



Next up was a calming and focused Nail Art Workshop. Under the guidance of a professional lecturer, students learned how to use a nail dotting pen to apply decorative dots and patterns. It was lovely to watch them carefully crafting their designs, demonstrating patience, attention to detail, and a real flair for style.



To round off the morning, the group took part in a Media Make-Up Session, part of the wider Hair and Media Make-Up course that equips learners with vital skills for the make-up and special effects industry. The session began with a demonstration of the bruise wheel, a tool used to create realistic fake bruises. Using step-by-step guides, the students applied colour to their arms and the results were surprisingly convincing!



Then came the most dramatic activity, creating fake cuts using special wax and fake blood. With some impressive artistic effort, many students managed to produce shockingly realistic results!

The activity was a fantastic success, giving students a hands-on insight into the exciting world of hair, beauty, and special effects.

This term, Year 7 students had a unique opportunity to explore the world of digital design and 3D printing, thanks to a special workshop led by Ian Hankey, a master glass-maker and digital designer from Arts University Plymouth.

During the session, students learned how to create 3D shapes and characters, then transfer their designs into CAD software to prepare them for 3D printing. It was a hands-on introduction to how creative ideas become real objects using digital technology.

A really exciting and surreal moment was when volunteer staff members were scanned using a 3D scanner while rotating on a turntable. They later received mini 3D-printed figures of themselves!

Arts University Plymouth regularly runs workshops for schools, both on campus and in local classrooms. Through their *Fab Lab*, students can get hands-on with tools like 3D printers, laser cutters, and scanning software; perfect for anyone curious about design, engineering, or tech.

These sessions are a great way to learn real-world skills and get a taste of creative careers in areas like product design, architecture, animation, and sustainable manufacturing.

Girls in Maritime

South Devon College's Marine Academy is helping young women explore exciting opportunities in the maritime industry through its inspiring "Girls in Maritime" events. Aimed at students aged 11–16, these events are designed to challenge gender stereotypes and encourage more girls to consider marine careers.

Participants take part in a variety of hands-on activities, including marine wiring workshops, navigation and mapping challenges, time on the vessel simulator, and onthe-water experiences. These sessions offer a real insight into the industry and help students develop valuable practical skills.

Each event also includes talks from successful women working in the maritime sector. By sharing their career journeys and experiences, they inspire the next generation and show what's possible with determination and passion.

South Devon College is committed to promoting equality and diversity in the marine industry. Through events like these, the College is working to close the gender gap and ensure more young women feel confident pursuing maritime careers.

The College partners with local schools such as Churston Ferrers Grammar School and Brixham College to make these events accessible. For those interested in going further, the Marine Academy offers a range of marine courses, including RYA qualifications for both leisure and commercial boating.

Summer jobs and volunteering are fantastic ways to: Build confidence, learn new skills, make new friends, earn money (with a job) or give back (through volunteering), boost your CV for the future.

Thinking About a Summer Job? Here's what you need to know:

Finding a Job

- Look locally: Try shops, cafés, supermarkets, and sports centres.
- Search online: Websites like Indeed or your local council's site often list jobs.
- Start early: Many places start hiring in spring, so don't wait until July!
- CV Tips: Keep it simple include your school, hobbies, and why you want to work.

What Employers Expect

- Punctuality: Always be on time (or early!).
- Positive Attitude: Be polite, helpful, and open to learning.
- Neat Appearance: Follow any dress codes (e.g. uniform).
- Reliability: Show up and be someone your boss can count on.

Health & Safety

- You must get training for the job.
- You should be given safety gear (like gloves or aprons) if needed.
- Always ask for help if you feel unsafe or unsure about something.

Travel Tips

- Plan your route in advance check bus or train times, or arrange a lift.
- Try a test journey and always allow extra time.

Legal Working Hours (Ages 13–16)

- Ages 13–14: Up to 5 hours/day, 25 hours/week (during holidays)
- Ages 15–16: Up to 8 hours/day, 35 hours/week
- Max 2 hours on school days, and no working before 7am or after 7pm

Always have a trusted adult nearby, you'll need parental permission and the organisation should have insurance covering youth volunteers.
